# **Moment for Missions**

At The Salvation Army, we know that one of the first results to occur in times of crisis is food insecurity. Many families don't know where their next meal will come from. Whether the cause is a natural disaster, financial strain, or a pandemic, many families in need struggle to find nutritional food on a regular basis.





In the 2023 fiscal year, we served 3,518 boxes of groceries, which helped serve a total of 7,511 people groceries. As of last year, on average we served 202 people per month a hot meal and a total of 2,424 people served throughout the year. Our Hot Meal program is held every Friday from 12:00 pm to 12:30 pm. If we have leftovers from this, we give out seconds on the meal or offer take home dishes.






