



We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.





The Seven Flames is a symbol of the coming of the Holy Spirit

The Lamp stands for Wisdom and Knowledge.



Chrismon's

Chrismons, meaning "Christ monograms," traditionally are white and gold designs made from Christian symbols that signify Christ. Often displayed on an evergreen tree during the Christmas season, symbols such as stars, crosses, fish, crowns, and the alpha and omega remind us of Christ's identity, his story, and of the Holy Trinity.

Chrismons were first developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer and the women of the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA.

The **Alpha and Omega** stands for Christ who says "I am the beginning and the end, the first and the last".



The **Creator's Star** represents the six days of creation. It is also called the Star of David and is a symbol of Zionism.



The Crown symbolizes the kingship of Christ and His vistory over sin and death. It also symbolizes the reward of the faithful

Ruins of Jericho's wall

The ruins on the left are domestic structures (residences) which were incorporated into a casement wall (part of the inner wall is visible on the right) constructed during the Middle Bronze Age III (1650-1550 BC).

A person dwelling within a residence inside the wall of the city was an ordinary practice in the ancient Near East, maximizing the economy of space. During times of anticipated siege, it was a common practice for these structures to be filled in so as to increase the overall strength of the wall.

Out of view, beneath the vantage point of the photographer, was an older tower fortification which could have been maintained into that period and continued to be utilized in the city's defense.

Presuming the older date for the Exodus (~1440 BC), it is reasonable to presume that what is pictured here may well have been part of the fabled Jericho walls that "...came a tumblin' down...", or at least would have been representative of those walls' construction. Therefore, this evidence fits the Biblical description of Rahab assisting the Israelite spies to escape from Jericho at the beginning of the Canaanite conquest. "Then she let them down by a rope through the window, for her house was built into the city wall, so that she lived in the wall." (Jos. 2:15 ESV)
